Queens Scout Award (QSA)

We both joined 1st Linslade Scout Group when we were young Beavers and for the next twelve years, moved on to Cubs, Scouts and Explorers and currently Scout Network. In Explorers we signed up for the Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE) which is a minimum four year programme involving volunteering, new skills, physical activities and expeditions. Both of us volunteered as Young Leaders and our new skills included sailing, archery, maths, chess and learning to drive. The final Gold level of the DofE was the most challenging. We spent ten days survival camping and hiking in The Peak District and Snowdonia in wet, cold and windy weather; coping with tonsillitis and food poisoning (Nic). For our residential element, we crewed a tall ship in the Irish Sea for a week. We set off from Liverpool, sailed to Anglesey, Ireland, the Kintyre peninsular and docked at Greenock in Scotland. On the last leg we sailed through force 10 winds when even the ferries had stopped running and the conditions were so bad that one of the permanent crew was thrown across the galley and taken to hospital. It was certainly character building and something to remember!

Having gained the DofE gold award and with 100+ nights away already under our belts, in order to meet the QSA criteria we only had to complete 18 nights away (12 camping) as an Explorer, two extra QSA activities and a presentation to the District Commissioner (if you don't have DofE gold, you have to do QSA challenges instead). The QSA is the highest award in Scouting and there were only five QSA holders in our district before us, so we were very proud. We went to Buckingham Palace in May for the DoE Gold award and we are expecting an invitation from the Queen to attend a QSA celebration at Windsor Castle on St George's Day next year.

What is a 'maintenance day'?
